Program Coordinator

Position Status: Full-Time (35 hours per week)

Applicants MUST BE available: Monday through Friday 11:00am-6:30pm. The hours for this position are mainly after school hours; however, there are extended hours on days that school is out and in the summer.

Salary & Benefits:

\$17.00-\$18.00 per hour. Increased salary may be available for bi-lingual speakers.

Project Learn Program Overview: Project Learn is an afterschool program for youth that offers tutoring and homework assistance; computer labs; special events; art; social recreation; and positive role models. Offering a caring, safe place for youth to go after school, Project Learn provides a structured and positive atmosphere where young people can learn and play.

General Description: The position will provide afterschool programming for school age youth. The position requirements include overseeing staff in the planning, developing and implementing of programs in a variety of core areas; providing guidance and discipline for youth; and working with parents and partners for the success of the youth.

Requirements and Qualifications:

- Four year degree in related field from an accredited college or university, or equivalent, is preferred
- Minimum of two years' work experience in a Boys & Girls Club or similar organization planning and supervising activities based on the developmental needs of young people is preferred.
- Strong communications skills, both oral and written
- Demonstrated organizational, staff and project management abilities
- Group leadership skills, including an understanding of group dynamics
- Must be 21 years old or older
- Must pass National Background Check and Driving Record Check
